**Dispensations 1** partial and 15 full dispensations were given to Presbyters . **Scrutineers** were appointed.

Synod confirmed the **Representatives to Conference 2023** and delegated the District Council to fill the remaining vacancies on its behalf.

## **Keynote Address on Community Change**

Revd Charity Nzegwu (Co-Chair of Justice, Dignity & Solidarity Connexional Committee) & Revd Matt Finch (Pioneering & Church Planting Officer, Evangelism & Growth Team) spoke to Synod on how their work impacts community change.

Secretary of District Council introduced **District Council Business**.

Appointments were agreed including the appointments of the following presbyters: Rev'd Steven Cooper(District representative to Methodist Council), Rev'd Andrew Dart (Authorised Ministries Commission Convenor, Revd Esther Akam (Candidates Committee Chaplain). Synod delegated to the District Council any further appointments to be made before April 2023.

The Sabbaticals Secretary introduced the work of the Sabbaticals Advisory Group. Synod agreed the names of those due for sabbaticals in 2022/03 and those deferring to 2023/24

The Synod agreed to appoint the Presbyteral Synod Secretary as a standing representative to Conference as recommended by the District Council.
